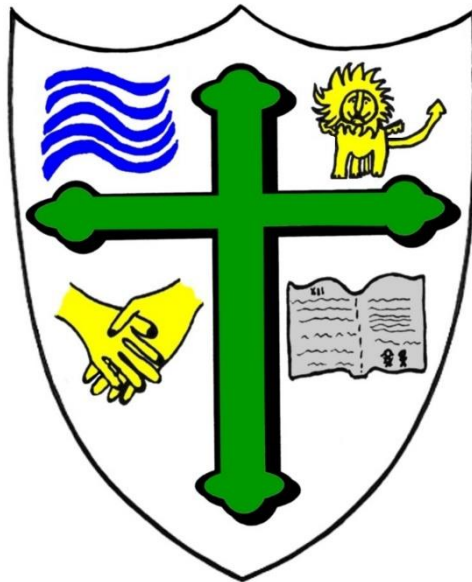

- Supervise their children on the playground at all times when dropping off and picking up children from school.
- Show respect and compassion for everyone within our school community.

Children have a responsibility to:

- Behave well in school, reflecting the expectations within our Behaviour and Relationships Policy.
- Think of others in everything they do.
- Always try their best with their learning and behaviour.
- Tell a grown up at school if anyone is hurting or upsetting them.
- Look after the school and everything in it.
- Listen to all adults in the school.
- Look after their belongings.
