Key Curriculum Vocabulary	Definition
Key	An explanation of what different lines and symbols on the map mean, as well as scale for you to work out the distance.
Topography	The arrangement of the natural and artificial physical features of an area.
Opaque	Something is not transparent and you can't see through it. For example, a wall is opaque because you can't see what's on the other side.
Translucent or transparent	"Transparent"-means you can see clearly through something because light passes straight through it, like a window, while "translucent" means you can only see a blurry image through something because only some light passes through, like a wax paper sheet.
Expedition	A journey or trip that is organized for a specific purpose, such as exploring, scientific research

	Phrase	a small group of words that go together to express a single idea
	Personal pronouns	a word that replaces someone's name in a sentence, like "I," "you," "he," "she," "it," "we," and "they,"
	Reported speech	when you tell someone what another person said, you need to change the "I," "you," "he," "she" words
	Present tense	used to describe actions or events that are happening right now, or that happen regularly.
	Adverbs	a word that describes how, when, where, or to what extent something happens

<p>Multiplication and division: Multiplying 2 digit by 1 digit numbers using expanded method.</p> <p>Fractions: Comparing and ordering fractions, counting in fractions and equivalent fractions.</p>	inverse	the opposite calculation e.g. multiplications and division. To solve a missing number sentence problem you can use the inverse.
	partition	to divide something into parts or shares.
	Numerator	The top number of a fraction showing the number of parts.
	Denominator	The number of equal parts the item is divided into.
