Don't forget to read a variety of text types, both fiction and non fiction.



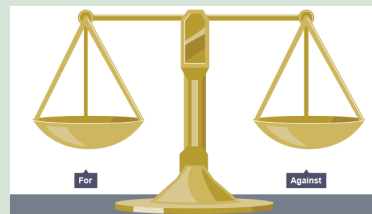

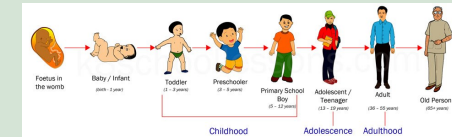

English	Key Vocabulary	Definition
<p>To write a balanced argument (discursive piece of writing) based on events from an Ancient Greek myth.</p> <p>Children will learn and apply discrete grammar to their writing.</p> <p>In Reading, children will read a range of challenging texts and focus on reading fluency (echo and choral reading) and comprehension based questions.</p>	Causal conjunctions	<p>They are words which are used to explain how things work or why things happen.</p> <p>E.g. because, so, therefore, Consequently</p> <p>The trip was cancelled because it was raining.</p>
	Pronouns	<p>Pronouns are words that take the place of nouns in a sentence. They help to avoid repeating the same words.</p> <p>E.g. I, he, she, it, we, they</p>
	Discursive writing	<p>It is a piece of writing which puts across reasons for and against a question. E.g. Should children have mobile phones?</p> <p>It concludes with the viewpoint of the writer.</p>
	Formal and informal	<p>Formal language is used for more official and serious purposes. The correct grammar should always be used.</p> <p>In informal situations and informal writing, a more relaxed casual and chatty style can be used. Slang words and abbreviations are more acceptable.</p>

Maths	Key vocabulary	Definition
To develop knowledge of decimals and percentages.	Decimal	Decimals are represented as digits following a decimal point. The decimal point is placed at the right of the ones column. Each column after the decimal point is a decimal place.
	Percentage	The number of parts per hundred and recorded using the notation %. One half can be expressed as 50%.
	Round	Express to a required degree of accuracy e.g. round to one decimal point. 1.34 to 1 decimal place is 1.3
	Equivalent fractions	Fractions with the same value as another.
