Definition

Artefact (History)	An object from or related to the past
Chronology (History)	An arrangement of events in the order that they took place
Ensemble (Music)	A group of musicians
Carbohydrates, protein, fat, fibre, and dairy (Science)	The different food groups.
Invertebrate (Science)	An animal having no backbone e.g. spider, insect, snail
Nutrition (Science)	The process of taking in and absorbing nutrients
Skeleton (Science)	A framework of bone or cartilage supporting or containing the body of an animals and humans.
Source (History)	Something that tells us about history e.g. an artefact, newspaper article, video clip.
Vertebrate (Science)	An animal with a spine/backbone.

Fronted adverbials

Fronted adverbials are words or phrases placed at the beginning of a sentence which are used to describe the action that follows. E.g. Last Saturday or After the sun came out,

Paragraph

A section of writing around a key idea.

Suffix

A letter or group of letters added to the end of a word.

Prefix

A letter or group of letters added to the beginning of a word.

Contraction

A shortened form of a word or words.

Verb

A word of being or doing.

Pronoun

I, it, he, she, myself, something etc.

Conjunction

A word to join ideas together. E.g. and, but, because, if, when

Place Value: Using a range of manipulatives to understand the value of 2 nd 3 digit numbers and develop fluency of number knowledge.

Addition and Subtraction: To use place value grids and formal written methods.

Array

An orderly arrangement—often in rows, columns or a matrix—used as a visual tool for demonstrating multiplication and division

Base 10/ Diennes

A visual, physical representation of 1, 10, 100 & 1000

Digit

A written symbol for any of the ten numbers from 0 to 9

Number

A quantity or value expressed by a word or symbol

Place value

The value or worth of a digit in a number

Explaining & proving your thinking
