English	Key Vocabulary	Definition
<p>To write a portal story based on The Lion, The Witch and The Wardrobe.</p> <p>Children will learn and apply discrete grammar to their writing.</p> <p>In Reading, children will read a range of challenging texts and focus on reading fluency (echo and choral reading) and vocabulary based questions.</p>	Portal	Usually a doorway, gate, or other entrance which leads to another contrasting setting.
	Contrasting Setting	One setting which is the opposite to the other setting.
	Colons	A colon is a punctuation mark that can be used to introduce a list or to separate two independent but linked clauses (colons are used to stress that both clauses in the sentence are closely linked and the second clause emphasises, adds clarification, or adds further detail to the first clause.
	Subordinate clauses	A subordinate clause contains a subject and a verb, but it needs to be attached to a main clause because it cannot make sense on its own. For example: Lucy entered the wardrobe, although she did not know what lay ahead.
	Relative clauses	A relative clause can be used to give additional information about a noun. They are introduced by a relative pronoun like 'that', 'which', 'who', 'whose', 'where' and 'when'. For example: Her brother, who was the sort of boy to pull wings from a fly, was cross.

Maths	Key vocabulary	Definition
To develop knowledge of multiplication and division	Multiple	A number that belongs to that number's times table. For example, the multiples of 2 are all the numbers in the 2 times table.
	Factor	Factors are numbers which can be multiplied together to create another number. For example, the factors of 8 are: 1, 2, 4, 8
	Prime number	A whole number greater than 1 that has only two factors: 1 and itself
	Square and cube numbers	A square number is a number multiplied by itself (e.g. 4x4 equals 16). A cube number is a number multiplied by itself three times (e.g. 4x4x4=64).
